## **ABOUT PROJECT**

**CORE-STEP** is a collaborative project between Universitas Syiah Kuala (Indonesia) and Griffith University (Australia), with partnering organisations including the Health Crisis Centre, Ministry of Health Indonesia; ICLEI Indonesia Local Governments for Sustainability, Cerdas Antisipasi Risiko Bencana / Smart Disaster Risk Prevention (CARI); Universitas Mataram, Universitas Pattimura, Universitas Syiah Kuala, International Network of Health Promoting Hospitals & Health Services.

The project's primary goal is to strengthen primary health care centres - known as Puskesmas in Indonesia, by delivering climate-just services that address the adverse effects of climate change.

Data collection will be conducted at selected sites in Indonesia (Banda Aceh, Ambon and Mataram) and the project includes an exchange visit and knowledge sharing, focusing on selected Primary Health Networks in Queensland, Australia.
